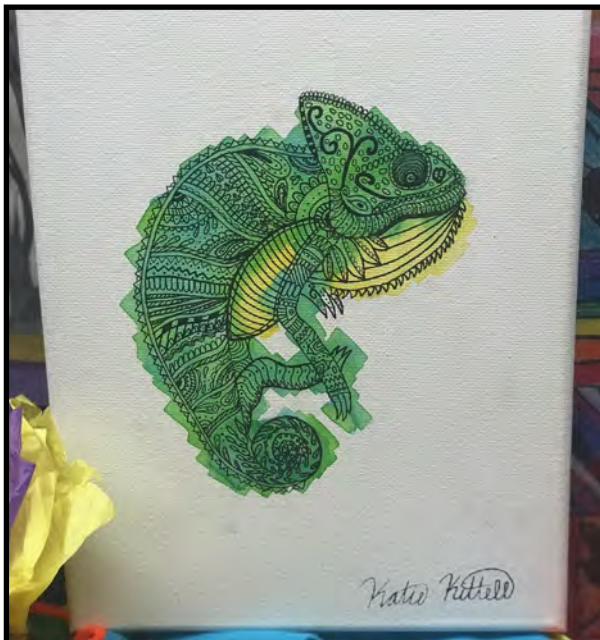
The Showcase also included an art show with over 100 pieces of art on display from South View Upper Elementary, North Ridge Middle School, and Danville High School.
